Thanks to Dr. Laurie Richardson, DVM, of Oaks North Animal Hospital, the HC neighborhood pet registry has another tool to help lost pets find their way home. Up until now, when an unidentified pet was found in HC or in our neighboring communities, we had to take the pet to a local veterinarian or to the Shavano Park pet registry to determine if the animal was micro-chipped. Now that we have our own scanner, we can scan the animal right away. If the animal doesn't have a chip, then we will first check our database to see if the animal is registered. If it isn't then we will send out an email and put up signs in the neighborhood.

As of 25 January 2008, we have 123 pets registered in the HC neighborhood registry, and we have helped 29 dogs find their way home. Please, register your pet on line. It is easy and takes about 2 minutes to do. A registered pet makes finding the owner easy. Of course, the pet is always very happy to be back to it's home.
